All students enrolled in GT English 9 must read the following <u>2 short stories</u> prior to the first day of school:

# 1. "The Yellow Wallpaper" by Charlotte Perkins Gilman (1892) [link here]

Summary: "The Yellow Wallpaper" explores psychology, gender roles, and mental illness. Told through journal fragments of an ill narrator, the story examines her struggle and descent into madness.

# 2. "Cell One" by Chimamanda Ngozi Adichie (excerpt from *The Thing Around Your Neck*) (2007)

Summary: Taking place in Nigeria, "Cell One" tells a story of culture, corruption, and cults. The narrator discusses the imprisonment of her 17-year-old brother after he robs the family home.

### **Assignments:**

- 1. **Notes:** As you read <u>both stories</u>, take organized notes on the following:
  - Characters & their development → who are they? How do they change over the course of the story?
  - Setting → when & where does the story take place?
  - Themes  $\rightarrow$  major subjects, topics, and messages in the story
  - Influences → what is affecting the main characters? What is having an impact on their actions/thoughts/decisions?
- 2. **Quizzes:** Be prepared for graded reading comprehension quizzes for <u>both</u> of these texts on the first day of school.
- 3. **Essay:** Students should be prepared to write <u>one essay</u> during the first week of school that responds to the following prompt:

Analyze how the author of your chosen story uses a complex character to develop a clear theme. Consider how the character's development, influences, and interactions reveal this theme.
